## **Quality Proposals and Financial Stability Proposals**

The proposals below are of four types: quality, student success, financial stability and housekeeping. The quality proposals concern the overall quality of the academic experience, with particular attention to performance assessment, the standards for just cause removal as they relate to potential EO Plan violations and the implementation of the new student evaluation instrument in particular courses. The student success proposals address the desired approach to student advising, faculty participation in programmatic review and accreditation, mid-term assessments, keeping attendance as it relates to federal financial aid, use of a university's LMS, remote training and minimizing sabbatical disruptions to the student experience. The financial stability proposals concern the need for the universities to adapt to a changing enrollment environment, if necessary. The housekeeping proposals memorialize sick leave policy, the electronic submission of materials and the use of pronouns throughout the CBA.
